***AFFIRMATION OF FAITH** (*Excerpt from the PC(USA) Confession of 1967*)

In Jesus of Nazareth true humanity was realized once for all. Jesus, a Palestinian Jew, lived among his own people and shared their needs, temptations, joys, and sorrows. He expressed the love of God in word and deed and became a sibling to all kinds of sinful people. But his complete obedience led him into conflict with his own people. His life and teaching judged their goodness, religious aspirations, and national hopes. Many rejected him and demanded his death. In giving himself freely for them, he took upon himself the judgment under which all people stand convicted. God raised him from the dead, vindicating him as Messiah and Lord. The victim of sin became victor, and won the victory over sin and death for all people. The risen Christ is the Savior for all. Those joined to him by faith are made righteous before God and are commissioned to serve as God's reconciling community. Christ is the head of this community, the church, which began with the apostles and continues through all generations.
